#### EASA Part-66 Basic theoretical examinations: Void and confusing Certificates of Recognition

Dear Madam / Sir,

1. Please be informed that the Aircraft Industries, a.s. CZ.147.0010 organization has declared the following Certificates of Recognition void:

It is possible that those candidates may apply for a Part-66 Aircraft Maintenance Licence to some EU NAA.

The Aircraft Industries, a.s. CZ.147.0010 organization has no possibility to re-examine the above mentioned 7 candidates since the Civil Aviation Authority of the Czech Republic has raised level 1 finding against the organization and subsequently reduced their Part-147 Approval Certificate to provide basic Part-66 theoretical examinations only for those applicants who have passed a full basic training course (in the Czech language) in that organization.

2. Secondly, Aircraft Industries, a.s. CZ.147.0010 has issued Certificates of Recognition, using an incorrect template. This could be confusing because these certificates contain a sentence "attended training course and successfully passed examination". The meaning of the sentence is that the holder has attended consultations-sessions and passed examinations, but did not

complete a full basic training course. To correct this most of these Certificates of Recognition have been re-issued by CZ.147.0010 so that now contain only a sentence "successfully passed examination". Nevertheless some copies of their older version may appear. The reissued Certificates of Recognition are listed in the table below:

Anyhow the Civil Aviation Authority of the Czech Republic recommends to all other EU NAAs to consider all the Certificates of Recognition issued by the CZ.147.0010 Aircraft Industries organization as a valid document stating that the holder has passed theoretical examinations only, but not the full basic training course. This regardless to the fact whether the certificate contains a sentence "attended training course and successfully passed examinations" or only "successfully passed examinations". In the unlikely case that applicants claim that full training course is completed, the school and or the Civil Aviation Authority of the Czech Republic should be contacted for verification. In that case the certificate shall show the passing dates of all modules.
