Passenger traffic by geographic scope and carrier type. Rank top-3 apt.











Comparison to same period 2022 and 2019

The nationwide air traffic data related to February 2023 have been compared to the same month of the previous year (2022) and to 2019, as pre-Pandemic benchmark. Here following the **scheduled** and **charter** traffic data related to passengers, cargo and flights.

Traffic data related to <u>passengers</u> show as during **February 2023** about **11,0 M** of persons have been moved, recording an **increase** of **+54,0%** compared to the same month of last year. Assuming 2019 as benchmark, it results that the passengers sector **has not recovered pre-Pandemic values**, with a negative trend of **-4,9%** compared to February 2019.


As far as <u>cargo</u> sector concerns, during **February 2023** air traffic reached about **75,8 K tons**, recording a **decrease** of **-7,8%** compared to the same period of the previous year. Assuming as benchmark 2019, cargo sector **has recovered pre-Pandemic values**, with a positive trend of **+1,9%** compared to February 2019.



Passengers - February 2023

National Scope - Top-5 Airports

In February the **national passengers** air traffic recorded 4.019.539 units, corresponding to **37%** out of the total and an increase of +22,7% compared to the same period of the previous year. **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **1.919.022 units**, accounting for the **48%** out of total domestic passengers traffic, with an increase of **+27,8%** compared to February. **Roma Fiumicino** is the first airport in terms of national air traffic, with a market share of 13%, which matches to 520.770 passengers. Connections Roma Fiumicino - Catania Fontanarossa represent the main route.





Passengers - February 2023

International Scope - Share by geographical area

In February the **international passengers** traffic recorded **6.955.285 units**, corresponding to **63%** out of total. As compared to the same month of the previous year, there is an **increase** of **+80,6%**. Data have been processed excluding national traffic, therefore the traffic share with European Union does not include domestic one (4.019.539 passengers). The **Europe - EU**, is the geographical area to which the most traffic is observed with **Spain** being the first country and **Roma Fiumicino - Madrid Barajas** the main route.



International Scope - Change in traffic by geographical area

Data elaborated by geographical area show how, in <u>absolute</u> terms, the highest growth rate has been recorded in **Caribbean & South America** area: **+496,6%**, corresponding to an increase of total international traffic by +2,0%, meaning **+75.134** passengers. In <u>relative</u> terms, instead, the **Europe - EU** has been the geographic area that had the greatest impact on total traffic: **+45,6%**, meaning **+1.755.040** passengers.

Low-cost Carriers

In February the **low-cost** passengers air traffic recorded 7.206.419 units, corresponding to **66%** out of the total and an increase of **+32,4%** compared to the same period of the previous year. Furthermore, the comparison between low-cost and legacy segments shows that the **share** of low-cost has decreased by 11 percentage points . **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **3.926.828 units**, accounting for the **54%** out of total low-cost passengers traffic, with an increase of +42,4% compared to February. **Bergamo Orio al Serio** is the first airport in terms of low-cost air traffic, with a market share of 14%, which matches to 1.031.939 passengers. Connections Milano Malpensa - Catania Fontanarossa represent the main route.

Legacy Carriers

In February the **legacy** passengers air traffic recorded 3.768.405 units, corresponding to **34%** out of the total and an increase of **+123,7%** compared to the same month of the previous year. Furthermore, the comparison between legacy and low-cost segments shows that the share of legacy has increased by 11 percentage points . **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **2.860.564 units**, accounting for the **76%** out of total legacy passengers traffic, with an increase of +124,6% compared to February 2022. **Roma Fiumicino** is the first airport in terms of legacy air traffic, with a market share of 34%, which matches to 1.285.728 passengers. Connections Roma Fiumicino - Madrid Barajas represent the main route.

Cargo - February 2023

National Scope - Top-5 Airports

In February the **national cargo** air traffic recorded 7.865 tons, corresponding to **10%** out of total and an increase of +2,3% compared to the same period of the previous year. **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **5.463 tons**, accounting for the **69%** out of total domestic cargo traffic, with an increase of **+5,0%** compared to February 2022. **Milano Malpensa** is the first airport in terms of national cargo air traffic, with a market share of 33%, which matches to 2.563 tons. Connections Napoli Capodichino - Milano Malpensa represent the main route.





In February the **international cargo** air traffic recorded **67.969 tons**, corresponding to **90%** out of total. As compared to the same month of the previous year, there is a **decrease** of **-8,8%**. Data are processed excluding national traffic, therefore the traffic share with European Union does not include domestic one (7.865 tons). The **Europe - EU** is the geographical area to which the most traffic is observed, with **Germany** being the first country and **Milano Malpensa - Leipzig-Halle** the main route.



Data elaborated by geographical area show how, in <u>absolute</u> terms, the highest growth rate has been recorded in **Caribbean & South America**: **+12,8%** area, corresponding to an increase of total international traffic by +0,2%, meaning **+138** tons. Also in <u>relative</u> terms the **Caribbean & South America** has been the geographic area that had the greates impact on total traffic: **+0,2%**.

Cumulative traffic since the beginning of the year







Passenger traffic by geographic scope and carrier type. Rank top-3 apt.










The nationwide air traffic data related to the period January - February have been compared to the same month of the previous year (2022) and to 2019, as pre-Pandemic benchmark. Here following the **scheduled** and **charter** traffic data related to passengers, cargo and flights.


Traffic data related to <u>passengers</u> show as during the period <u>January</u> - <u>February</u> about <u>22,5</u> M of persons have been moved, recording an <u>increase</u> of +71,5% compared to the same period of last year. Assuming 2019 as benchmark, it results that the passenger sector <u>has not recovered pre-Pandemic values</u>, with a negative trend of -4,1% compared to the period January - February 2019.

As far as <u>cargo</u> sector concerns, during the period **January - February** air traffic reached about **150,1 K tons**, recording a **decrease** of **-8,9%** compared to the previous period of last year. Assuming 2019 as benchmark, cargo sector **has not recovered pre-Pandemic values**, with a negative trend of **-1,0%** compared to January - February 2019.



National Scope - Top-5 Airports


During the period January - February, **domestic passengers** air traffic recorded 8.435.132 units, corresponding to **37%** out of the total and an increase of +34,9% compared to the same period of last year. **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **3.983.433 units**, accounting for the **47%** out of total domestic passengers traffic, with an increase of **+38,8%** compared to January - February 2022. **Roma Fiumicino** is the first airport in terms of national air traffic, with a market share of 13%, witch matches to 1.080.591 passengers. Connections Roma Fiumicino - Catania Fontanarossa represent the main route.





International Scope - Share by geographical area


During the period January - January - February the **international passengers** traffic recorded **14.087.761 units**, corresponding to **63**% out of total. As compared to the same period of the previous year, there is an **increase** of **+104,8%**. Data are processed excluding national traffic, therefore the traffic share with European Union does not include domestic one (8.435.132 passengers). The **Europe - EU**, is the geographical area to which the most traffic is observed with **Spain** being the first country and Roma Fiumicino - Madrid Barajas the main route.





International Scope - Change in traffic by geographical area

Data elaborated by geographical area show how, in <u>absolute</u> terms, the highest growth rate has been recorded in **Caribbean & South America**: +423,6% area, corresponding to an increase of total international traffic by +2,2%, meaning +153.948 passengers. In <u>relative</u> terms, instead, the **Europe - EU** has been the geographic area that had the gratest impact on total traffic: +61,4%, meaning +4.221.889 passengers.





Low-cost Carriers

During the period January - February the **low-cost** passengers air traffic recorded 14.872.569 units, corresponding to 66% out of the total and an increase of +51,2% compared to the same period of the previous year. Furthermore, the comparision between low-cost and legacy segments shows that the **share** of low-cost has decreased by 9 percentage points . Top five airports reached a traffic of 7.990.222 units, accounting for the 54% out of total low-cost passengers traffic, with an increase of +62,7% compared to January - February 2022. **Bergamo Orio al Serio** is the first airport in terms of national air traffic, with a market share of 15%, which matches to 2.176.148 passengers. Connections Milano Malpensa - Catania Fontanarossa represent the main route.



Legacy Carriers

During the period January - February the **legacy** passengers air traffic recorded 7.650.324 units, corresponding to **34%** out of the total and an increase of +132,2% compared to the same period of the previous year. Furthermore, the comparison between legacy and low-cost segments shows that the share of legacy has increased by 9 percentage points. **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **5.808.702 units**, accounting for the **76%** out of total legacy passengers traffic, with an increase of +134,1% compared to January - February 2022. Roma Fiumicino is the first airport in terms of legacy air traffic, with a market share of 34%, which matches to 2.612.854 passengers. Connections Roma Fiumicino - Madrid Barajas represent the main route.

Cargo – January - February 2023

National Scope - Top-5 Airports

During the period January - February, **domestic cargo** air traffic recorded 15.605 tons, corresponding to **10%** out of the total and an increase of +3,1% compared to the same period of last year. **Top five airports** reached a traffic of **10.899 tons**, accounting for the **70%** out of total domestic cargo traffic, with an increase of **+6,7%** compared to January - February 2022. **Milano Malpensa** is the first airport in terms of domestic air traffic, with a market share of 32%, witch matches to 5.058 tons. Connections Napoli Capodichino - Milano Malpensa represent the main route.





During the period January - February the **international cargo** air traffic recorded **134.461 tons**, corresponding to **90%** out of total. As compared to the same period of the previous year, there is a **decrease** of **-10,1%**. Data are processed excluding national traffic, therefore the traffic share with European Union does not include domestic one (15.605 tons). The **Europe - EU** is the geographical area to which the most traffic is observed, with **Germany** being the first country and **Milano Malpensa - Leipzig-Halle** the main route.






Cargo – January - February 2023

Data elaborated by geographical area show how, in <u>absolute</u> terms, the highest growth rate has been recorded in **Caribbean & South America**: +35,3% area, corresponding to an increase of total international traffic by +0,4%, meaning +598 tons. Also in <u>relative</u> terms, **Caribbean & South America** has been the geographic area that had the greatest impact on total traffic: +0,4%.
